Distinguished Ladies and Gentlemen,

Great Akokites!

It gives me great pleasure to attend the 54th Convocation Ceremony of the University of Lagos. This indeed is the time to recognize and celebrate the graduating students who through hard work, dedication and commitment have fulfilled the prerequisite requirement to be awarded various degree(s) today. I commend all the organs of the University that have through their doggedness and commitment led to the Convocation of all the graduands today. Let me use this opportunity to acknowledge the Chancellor, and the Management Team, the Senate of the University, other members of Staff (Academic and Non-teaching), stakeholders and friends of the university as well as the graduating students who we are celebrating today.

I felicitate with all the graduating students of this Convocation ceremony which include Undergraduate and Post Graduate students. I am sure that with the quality of teaching and research that the University of Lagos has instilled in you, you are well positioned to compete and interact effectively with your counterparts globally.

Today, we will also be conferring Honorary Degrees "Honoris Causa "of the University to three (3) distinguished professionals who have made significant impact on education and development in Nigeria in their various activities. I will like to congratulate Professor Toyin Falola, Professor Attahiru Jega, *OFR* and Professor Phyllis Kankii who will be conferred with the Honorary Doctorate Degree of Letters (D. Litt - Honoris Causa) and Honorary Doctorate Degree of Science (D. SC - Honoris Causa) respectively.

My election as President of this great nation came at a critical time for the country. The peaceful democratic transition of government was a clear signal of our resolve as a nation to strengthen our belief in our capacity to reposition the country. Since assumption of office, my administration has continued to consult and dialogue with relevant stakeholders, groups and bodies in order to remodel our economy to bring about growth and development. This implies that we have had to take tough life changing

decisions. The removal of subsidy was one of our necessary actions because it can no longer justify its ever-increasing cost. There is need to re-channel the funds into better investment in public infrastructure, education and critical social needs to improve the life of our people, although the decision has had immediate adverse effect on the generality of our people including the Universities. I am not unaware of the impact and sacrifices that the university community, stakeholders, parents and guardian are grappling with in the last one year, but I am confident that we will all weather the storm.

The economic challenges of the country which affected everyone were such that we must take the bull by the horn now, not later. We have a future that must be carefully nurtured, hence, necessary machineries as well as important decisions must be put in place to take us to the nation of our dream. Universities are central to the attainment of a New Nigeria and all the support and necessary Changes must be put in place to achieve our desired aim.

To mitigate the challenges of the removal of subsidy, this administration has signed the Students' Loan Bill into law. Under this law, indigent Nigerian students will have access to interest-free loans to see them through their stay in government-owned higher institutions. Beneficiaries are expected to repay the borrowed sum once they start working two years after the mandatory national service. The law stipulates that any student whose parents earn more than Five Hundred Thousand Naira (N500,000.00) per annum will not qualify for the loan, thus limiting access to those who actually need the support. It is our policy that no Nigerian child must fail to go to school due to poverty.

In an ever-changing knowledge economy, we are expected to embrace transnational education and remain creative in methodology of delivery of education. The Federal Government commenced the implementation of the newly developed Core Curriculum Minimum Academic Standards (CCMAS) for the Nigerian University System in September, 2023. This offers the University the opportunity to develop the 30% of the contents of programmes by the individual University Senates to reflect the uniqueness of their various universities while 70% of the total content was provided by the experts under the watch of National Universities Commission (NUC). This

is expected to impact positively on Nigerian Universities as it is expected that CCMAS will assist to produce highly skilled and fit- for- purpose graduates in line with current realities. Recently, we approved the policy document for Transnational Education. The policy framework will facilitate collaborations and partnerships between tertiary institutions in Nigeria and other Universities globally through impact/quality research, joint programmes, knowledge exchange and innovations.

It is an imperative that quality University is essential for development, nation building and international relation. The University of Lagos has continued to blaze the trail of internationalization by fostering a true global institution by breaking the borders of partnership through building global partnerships, collaborations, joint degree programmes and quality research that will impact our country. The prospect and practice of internationalization also offers opportunity to further improve research collaboration and meet partners as well as network to enhance the global competitiveness of African researchers and institutions while actively contributing to the generation of knowledge crucial for the socio-economic transformation of our country and the continent of Africa. It is commendable that the leadership the University of Lagos has been consistent in this regard.

Like the proverbial saying, the youth are the future of the world. The current administration acknowledge this; hence a sizeable number of the current cabinet Ministers are in the youth category. As the latest graduating students, it is imperative that you must exemplify the knowledge gains, showcase the skills and competencies as well as contribute your quota to nation building. It is apparent that the current realities will throw up challenges that may push you back, but draw from the experience and knowledge you have gathered over the course of your study to come up with innovative ideas that will foster the socio-economic development of our dear country.

This Government and our administration have commenced the deployment of necessary parameters for the successful implementation of the 8-POINT Agenda which is expected to will deliver hope to our nation. We are confident that with the quality of academia at the disposal of this country, purpose fit research that will provide solutions to our peculiar challenges will be in the

front burner of the research activities in universities. We strongly believe that we will continue in the right developmental trajectory with the integration of quality graduates into the manpower base of our country. Therefore, we call on all stakeholders in the education sector to join us in this journey to repositioning Nigeria.

Once again, I congratulate the University of Lagos on its successful Convocation. I felicitate with the graduands of today, and wish you all success in future endeavours as you set out to achieving your set goals and dreams. I salute the Honorees of today, (Honoris Causa,) who have been recognized for their outstanding contributions in the development of education and society and I am sure that this award will ignite you more to continue to proffer innovative ideas that will develop tertiary education and our nation.

I congratulate all the parents and guardians for your support and encouragement which helped today's graduands to achieve their dreams.


