ASSESSMENT AND MANAGEMENT OF OCCUPATIONAL STRESS AMONG NURSES IN OGUN STATE: IMPLICATIONS FOR GENDER

This study examined the effect of Solution Focused Brief Therapy and Guided Enquiry Method on occupational stress among nurses in Ogun Sate, Nigeria. Nursing was identified an occupation that has high levels of stress. It was found that job stress brought about bezardous impacts not only on nurses' health but also their abilities to cope with job emands. The study was carried out in five government hospitals in Ogun states. This eriously impairs the provision of quality care and the efficacy of health services delivery Quasi-experimental pretest/post test control group design was adopted for the study. Simple random sampling was used to select a sample size of 150 nurses comprising of 13 male and 137 female nurses drawn from five government hospitals randomly selected from state. The two research instruments used to gather data for the study are Stress wentory (SI) and Experience of Work and Life Questionnaire (WLQ) which were adapted use by the researchers. Participants were drawn to participate in the study using the SI while the WLQ was used for both the pre and post test. The study revealed that there is no mificant impact of gender on occupation stress, however among female nurses there are her stress levels possibly due to multiple levels of responsibility. Solution Focused Brief berapy was however more effective in assisting nurses to cope effectively with stress resulting from their jobs.
