So loving and so compassionate he is to my wellbeing in UNILAG that he kept on asking the then Vice-Chancellor and other Professors present at the Lodge: Where is my son, Prof. Timothy-Asobele; go and fetch him. I was in the Library composing as usual one of my sixty-six books. The following morning Prof. Ade Ojo asked me what was your relationship with the Chancellor.
