## 2022 YEAR IN REVIEW

o much happened in the year 2022! Sixty years ago marked the beginning of the University of Lagos. The 60th anniversary celebration kicked off with a ceremony tagged "Touchdown at the Root". The robust and funfilled ceremony was held at the College of Medicine, IdiAraba on Monday, October 3,2022. We showcased the library as a repository with the retrieval and compilation of relevant and historical resources used for the production of the documentary on the university's history.

Following the event was the announcement of the appointment of the 13th and first female Vice Chancellor by the Governing Council on Friday, October 7, 2022. The University Library has repositioned its values, culture and services to respond to the needs and demands of our community in line with the "Eyes on the Future" vision. of the new Vice Chancellor, Prof. Folasade Ogunsola, FAS.

Reflecting on how we enhanced library service delivery in 2022, this annual report broadly highlights improvements in our operations,

services, finances, people and spaces. From the very first quarter, we introduced "Loan-A-Tablet" service to enhance access to learning resources, and launched an inclusive social event tagged Library Lover's Day. The idea of the social event was for students and staff to celebrate Valentine's Day in the library, address the consequences of social isolation triggered as a result of the impact of COVID 19 and industrial strike action of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) that kept students at home for about eight months.

In a bid to sustain access to electronic resources, the library maintained library-faculty synergy with the Distance Learning Institute (DLI) and World Bank Sustainable Procurement, Environmental and Social Standards Centre of Excellence. We greatly appreciate their contributions towards the payment of annual subscriptions of three (3) databases (Emerald Insight e-Books, Emerald Insight e-Journals and I.G Publishing e-Books).

My heart is full of gratitude to the Management of Alpha Morgan Capital for their commitment to sponsor the Makerspace and remodelling of the library lobby project. The flag-off ceremony was held on Thursday October, 20, 2022. While the proposed lobby outlook will create a welcoming environment for students to read, take coffee and mingle, the Makerspace will serve as an engagement hub with hitech tools for students to innovate, create, collaborate, and share practical knowledge. The project is expected to be completed in 2023.

On a happy note, I cannot end this welcome note without mentioning the approval of the National Universities Commission (NUC) for the University of Lagos to start Library and Information Science undergraduate programme in the Faculty of Social Sciences. For me, this is a dream come true.

Clearly, the future of library services in the University of Lagos looks promising. We therefore look forward with enthusiasm to unfolding development and events in 2023. ### Readers' Services Department

Sections under the Readers' Services Department are: Circulation, Reference, Law Library, Reserved Book Room, Boulos Engineering Library, Visually Impaired Resource Centre, and Faculty/Other Libraries. The department is also responsible for the coordination of the activities of Reading Rooms and Cloak Room. The Readers' Services Department is the arm of the library that have direct contact with users for services.

Services offered during the year 2022 are captioned under six sub-heading namely: library registration, library clearance, loan, users' head count, library resource usage and visually impaired resource centre. Other activities carried out in the department include reference/inquiry service, referral service, bibliographic search service, document delivery service, library tour/instruction and cloakroom services.



#### 1.1 Library Registration Service

During the year 2022, registration record was at its highest in the first quarter of the year but declined greatly in the second and third quarter due to disruptions of academic activities occasioned by the eight months strike embarked upon by the Academic Staff Union Universities (ASUU). Following resumption in the fourth quarter, a total of two thousand, nine hundred and forty (2,940) users' registration was recorded. Fig. 1.1 presents the users' registration data by category.



#### 1.2 Library Clearance Service

To ascertain that graduating students, expelled students as well as staff disengaging from the service of the university are not indebted to the library, these categories of users are subjected to library clearance service. During the year 2022, the library received and attended to eleven thousand, and ninety-seven (11,097) clearance requests as presented in Fig. 1.2.



#### 1.3 Loan Services

This service covers statistics of circulating books - accessible for long term loan, books in the Reserved Book Room - accessible for short term loan, and Tablets checked-out and checked-in, books renewed, as well as overdue and lost books. Loan requests treated during the year under review is presented in Fig. 1.3.

#### 1.4 User's Head Count

Periodic head count of library users are taken at regular intervals during opening hours. The data is generated from the various spaces accessible to users' within the main and faculty libraries. During the year 2022, users' count was one hundred and ninety-nine thousand, five hundred and sixty-eight (206,225), of which the main library recorded one hundred and forty-one thousand, and four hundred and twenty (141,420) users, while faculty and other libraries recorded sixty-four thousand, eight hundred and five (64,805) users. Fig. 1.4 presents the head count of users at the various library locations.



#### 1.5 Library Resource Usage & Other Activities

The Readers' Services Department provide access to library resources in the 2nd floor shelving area, Boulos Engineering library, Reserved Book Room (RBR) and Law library. Majority of resources available at the 2nd floor, Boulos library and RBR are textbooks, while resources in the Law library comprises textbooks, journals and law reports. The books consulted and other services provided in the various reading location in the department and the Faculty of Education library are represented in Fig. 1.5.



#### 1.6 Visually Impaired Resource Centre (VIRC)

The centre is saddled with the responsibility of meeting the information needs of students with visual impairment. It provides assistive technology service, converts lecture notes and other learning documents to braille and/or audio. The centre has a user population of sixty-two (62) visually impaired students and during the year 2022, two hundred and eighty-three (283) user visit was recorded, eleven (11) books were scanned and one (1) document was converted to braille as shown in Figure 1.6.



#### 2.1 Resource Received & Processed

During the year 2022, the Department received and processed a total of two thousand, one hundred and seventy-nine (2,179) newspapers of six (6) different types, namely: Guardian, Punch, Daily Sun, The Nation, This Day, and Vanguard newspapers. 

Record of information resources consulted in the Research and Bibliographic during the year are as captured in Fig.2.2.




The Technical Services Department promotes and facilitates procurement of library resources required to enhance research and curriculum development of programmes offered in the university. It comprises five sections, namely: Acquisitions, Cataloguing, Serials, Gifts & Exchange and Bindery. Report of operations carried out in these sections during the year under review are outlined in the subsequent headings.



#### 3.1 Acquisitions Section

Acquisition activities covers selection, purchase, auditing, accessioning, stamping, card entry, data entry into the Library Management System (LMS) and barcoding. During the year 2022, the number of books acquired to support academic programmes was seven hundred and thirty-two (732) titles of eight hundred and fifty-two (852) volumes. Acquisition by purchase was three hundred and forty-five (345) titles of three hundred and forty-nine (349) volumes while three hundred and eighty-seven (387) titles of five hundred and three (503) volumes were through donation.

The process of selection, purchase and auditing only applies to books acquired by purchase.



#### 3.11 Expenditure by Faculty

During the year 2022, the section expended a total of ten million, three hundred and twelve thousand, six hundred and eighteen thousand naira, ninety kobo (\mathbb{H}10,312,618.90) for purchase of textbooks for eight faculties as represented in Fig. 3.2.



#### 3.2 Cataloguing Section

Acquired library materials are processed in the Cataloguing section to ensure that books on same and related subject areas are grouped together on the shelves. During the year under review, activities carried out in the section include cataloguing and classification of books received from Acquisitions section, inputting bibliographic details of processed books into the Library Management Software (LMS) and catalogue cards, filing of processed catalogue cards, and distribution of processed books to various sections in the main and faculty libraries. The summary of activities are presented in Fig. 3.3.



#### 3.21 Book Distribution

During the year, the Cataloguing section dispatched one thousand, one hundred and ninety-eight (1,198) volumes of newly processed books to various shelf locations within the main and faculty libraries. The distribution is as captured in Fig. 3.4.



#### 3.3 Serials Section

During the year 2022, the section added a total of sixty-four (64) titles of two hundred and fortynine (249) volumes of print journals to its collection. Nine (9) titles of nine (9) volumes were procured by purchase while fifty-five (55) titles of two hundred and forty (240) volumes were donations.

The sum of fifty-seven thousand, five hundred naira (\pm 57,500.00) was expended on journal procurement. The section processed sixty-eight (68) titles of three hundred and twenty-nine (329) volumes of journals for distribution to the various faculties and the Journal section. Fig. 3.5 presents the record of journals acquired and processed for distribution.



#### 3.4 Gifts & Exchange Section

During the year under review, the section received materials through donations and exchange from its partners. One thousand, one hundred and eighty (1,180) titles of one thousand, eight hundred and twenty-six (1,826) volumes of textbooks, journals, CDs and audio cassette tapes were donated by individuals and organizations. Four (4) titles of forty-four (44) volumes of serial publications were received from Exchange Partners as shown in Fig. 3.6.

#### 3.5 Bindery Section

The section provides complementary services like binding of books, periodicals, thesis, dissertations, newspapers and other documents. During the year under review, the section carried out bindery services for clients only. A total of two hundred and twenty-eight (228) volumes of materials were treated.



#### 4.1 E-Library Services

E-library service was mainly accessed at the MTN Library during the year under review. The facility recorded a patronage of fourteen thousand, six hundred and twenty-five (14,625) users comprising of fourteen thousand, forty (14,040) undergraduate students, three hundred and eleven (311) postgraduate students, one hundred and sixty-eight (168) staff and one hundred and six (106) external users.



## 4.2 Library Databases & Usage

The library maintained subscription to electronic database to meet the information needs of its dynamic users. List of databases available in the library through the year 2022 are: ScienceDirect, Research4life, JSTOR, Emerald Insight, IG Publishing, LexisNexis, ProQuest Central E-Journal, ProQuest Ebook Central, JaypeeDigital, Biomedical and Life Sciences Collection and Cambridge Journals. 

## 4.3 Library Management Software (LMS)

During the year under review, users had unhindered access to the library's collection through its web-based Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) that is driven by the library management system. The number of hits/visits recorded on the OPAC was two hundred and seventy-seven thousand, seven hundred and sixteen (277,716).



## 4.4 Institutional Repository (IR)

The Institutional Repository (IR) has continued to record increase in number of submissions across its communities/faculties. During the year 2022, the library upgraded IR Application Software to sustain the functionality and effectiveness of the archived collections. The Repository has a total of nine thousand, seven hundred and twenty-eight (9,728) submissions distributed across its communities. 

## 4.5 Crossref - DOI Registration

During the year 2022, the library generated and assigned a total of twenty-one (21) DOIs for articles published in the International Journal of Mathematical Analysis and Optimization: Theory and Applications (IJMSO) and Journal of Basic and Social Pharmacy Research (JBSPR). 

## **Natural History Museum**

The Natural History Museum recorded one thousand one hundred and seventy-three (1,173) visitors during the year under review. One thousand one hundred and twenty-five (1,125) gave a review while forty eighty (48) without review.

### 7.1 Donation of Tablets

In February 2022, five hundred (500) Modio Tablets were deployed from the Office of the Vice Chancellor to the University Library to enhance access to learning resources for students and library users. The laudable initiative birthed the Loan-A-Tablets service in the library which allows students to loan the device just like they loan textbooks. Tablet workstations are located on all floors of the library to enable students and other library users to conduct searches on-the-go, browse the online catalogue for print resources, as well as read e-books and e-journals which are accessible on the library website.





## 7.2 Library Lover's Day

It was an engaging and fun-filled moment for students and friends of the library on Monday, February 14, 2022. The inaugural event tagged; Library Lover's Day was an initiative of the University Librarian to showcase the library as a social space and celebrate the day with students and staff.
