Among the early callers were the Lagos State Governor, Mr. Raji Babatunde Fashola (SAN) and his wife, Dame Abimbola Emmanuela Fashola, Ogun State Governor, Senator Ibikunle Amosun and his wife; immediate past Governor of Ogun State, Otunba Gbenga Daniel, representatives of the Committee of Vice-Chancellors of Nigerian Universities led by immediate past Chairman, Professor Isaq Oloyede, representatives of the Federal Government led by the Federal Minister of Education, Professor Ruqqayyat Ahmed Rufa'i, representatives of traditional rulers, captains of industries, among several others who passed one or two compliments on Professor Sofoluwe in their condolence messages.

Sofoluwe as the Vice-Chancellor of this prestigious University was fond of walking about carrying files, moving unperturbed among students and staff. He was indeed very unassuming to say the least.

He was loving and generous as well. Those who knew him closely would readily admit that he was generous to a fault. He lived a simple life and believed in sharing. He enjoyed being surrounded by people, especially the young ones. He was imbued with a good sense of humour, and hardly could anyone stay with him without being elated.

His vision to see the University among the first hundred universities in the world was the driving force behind his passionate, selfless and meritorious service to our University. All that occupied his mind before his death was how well to celebrate the jubilee anniversary of his beloved University.
